SUBJECT MATTER YOU CAN USE TO PLAY THESE GAMES:

- subject & course vocabulary & terminology (w/ or w/o definitions & explanations)
- synonyms, antonyms, & word associations pertinent to your subject & course
- subject & course principles, rules, laws, & other guidelines
- course text's chapter headings & subheadings
- course text's details & content
- subject & course topics & themes
- key names, biographical details, & contributions of: historical persons, scientists, authors, authorities, &etc. pertinent to your subject & course
- key review materials of course text(s) before quizzes, term tests, & major evaluations
- key review materials of subject & course content before quizzes, term tests, & major evaluations



Remember: Your students can also make up the cards, game boards, &etc. required to play review games in your classroom. In addition, students can submit questions (and the correct answers) for games as a class assignment in advance of your planned reviews. Ask them for assistance in setting up these games, moving the desks or tables in your room in the configuration required, and keeping score too.
